Rick Warren says, "Leadership without love is manipulation." What a statement! God's love places great value on you and me. God's love, described in Greek as *agape* love places no limits on its object. It gives and gives and gives and gives all there is to give. There is no limit to Christ's love for the church and neither should there be for ours.

Here are some notes that I have gathered through the years through sermons and commentaries.

The object of Christ's love and the love of a growing Christian is the church. The Greek word for church is *ekklesia*. The prefix, *ek* means "out" or "out of." The suffix, *kaleo* means "to call." In its most basic sense, *ekklesia* means "the called out." The New Testament uses *ekklesia* in two ways. First, there is the general sense, referring to all believers of this age, all the redeemed. We see it used this way in Ephesians 5:25 which says, "**Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her**." However, most of the time the New Testament uses the word "church" in a local sense, referring to a particular fellowship of believers in one locality. For example there is the church of Antioch or the church at Corinth or even Highland Church in Paducah, Kentucky. The local church is a visible, tangible representation of the eternal church that is being gathered in heaven (Heb.12:23). We are to love all believers everywhere, but we are especially to love the believers of our local church with whom we share our lives.

So we must ask the question: *how do we love the church?* Many pastors would be tempted to answer that question in one word: ATTENDANCE! They would camp out on Hebrews 10:24-25 and preach their whole sermon from that text... why not? It's worth a look, let's turn there!

"And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching."

What can we quickly learn here? Let me point out a few key instructions:

We are to "**consider one another**." We are to be thinking about one another, fellowshipping with one another, not living in isolation from each other all week and only seeing each other on Sunday mornings.

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We are to look for ways to "stir up" [used in reference to spurring a horse] one another in "love and good works."

We are not to be "forsaking the assembling of ourselves together." We are not to just blow off public worship, Bible studies and fellowship times. We don't want to be like "some" in that day who were negative examples. Rather we are to be present and to be "exhorting one another."

We are to realize that the necessity of the church grows greater as the world grows darker and "**the Day**," the day of God's judgment draws nearer.

Okay then, attendance should be a given. Attendance is the bare minimum sign of love for the church. What are the real signs of love for the church?

Help me out here. I have only been here for a few months and I feel so blessed to be part of a church that really loves people and want to grow. So, what does loving Highland look like to you? I know Christ is the head and we are His body. What intentional ways do you love His church? Attendance is a given so what are the ways you go about doing this? Please let me know. I will be waiting to hear your feedback!
