Rev. Glenn Warren of the Milburn Chapel CPC presented these statistics at the fall meeting of Presbytery.

I spoke with 200 people in the Paducah area, 50 in four different locations. Those locations were the Flood Wall, Noble Park, Wal-Mart, and the mall.

165 out of 200 claimed to be Christian.

25 other

10 agnostic or atheist

Result: 82% of those spoken to claimed to be Christian.

Of the 165 who claimed to be Christian, I asked them what makes them a Christian.

123 said because they go to church

33 said because they had accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior

9 said because they believe in Jesus

Therefore, 75% of those who claimed to be Christian said they are Christian just because they go to church.

Of those claiming to be Christian, I also asked: If you were to die today, would you be in heaven?

141 of the 165 said something similar to "I hope so, God knows my heart. I have tried to live a good life."

24 said yes, because Jesus died for my sins and He is Lord and Savior of my life.

Result: 85% of those claiming to be Christian weren't sure if they would even go to heaven.

Of those who did not claim to be Christian, 13 were Muslim, 6 Jehovah's Witness, 4 Jewish, and 2 Hindu.
