During the "Great Awakening" of the 1700's in to the 1800's the Presbyterians in North America split between the Old Side and the New Side. The split came about by the revivalistic techniques championed by the Great Awakening.

At the beginning of the 1800's the Presbyterians suffered from a shortage of educated clergy. The Cumberland Presbytery of the Kentucky Synod began ordaining men without the educational background required by Synod. This led to dissolvement of Cumberland Presbytery by Kentucky Synod.

On February 4, 1810 at Dixon, Tennessee in the log cabin home of Rev. Samuel McAdow, he, the Rev. Finis Ewing and the Rev. Samuel King reorganized Cumberland Presbytery. After rapid growth, Cumberland Presbytery became Cumberland Synod in 1813. In 1829 the first General Assembly was held and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church was establish.

A replica of Rev. Samuel McAdow's cabin plus a sandstone chapel commemorate the event of the birth of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Montgomery Bell State Park in Tennessee. As an outgrowth of the Great Revival of 1800, also called the "Second Great Awakening", the new denomination arose to embrace the so-called "Whosoever Will" gospel of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

May the "great" and "awesome" God we serve continue to bless our church. As a Cumberland Presbyterian minister I love the words "whosoever will" may come. Whosoever says, the gospel of Jesus Christ is there for anyone who calls upon His name will be saved.
