

Highland Church reaches out in the name of Jesus Christ building disciples with vision for ministry.

God's love, described in Greek as *agape* love places no limits on its object. It gives and gives .. gives all there is to give. Therefore, since God gave His only Son to bear our sins on the cross, God's *agape* for us is immeasurable. Likewise, as Christ is the head of the church and offered his body as a sacrifice for it, there is no limit to Christ's love for the church. As members of the body, we too are called to love the church.

The object of Christ's love and the love of a growing Christian is the church. The Greek word for church is *ekklesia*. The prefix, *ek* means "out" or "out of." The suffix, *kaleo* means "to call." In its most basic sense, *ekklesia* means "the called out." The New Testament uses *ekklesia* in two ways. First there is the general sense, referring to all believers of this age, all the redeemed. We've already seen it used this way in Ephesians 5:25 which says, "**Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her**." However, most of the time the New Testament uses the word "church" in a local sense, referring to a particular fellowship of believers in one locality. For example, there is the church of Antioch or the church at Corinth or even Highland CP Church in Paducah, KY. The local church is a visible, tangible representation of the eternal church that is being gathered in heaven (Heb. 12:23). We are to love all believers everywhere, but we are especially to love the believers of our local church with whom we share our lives.

So we must ask the question: how do we love the church? Hebrews 10:24-25 gives good instructions: "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching."

What can we quickly learn here? We are to "consider one another." We are to think about one another, fellowship with one another, be genuine brothers and sisters in Christ. We are to look for ways to "stir up" or excite each other in "love and good works" to do the many ministries of the church. We should always make a point to be present for worship, study groups and fellowship, not "forsaking the assembling of ourselves together" as even "some" in Paul's day already were. Finally, we are called to "exhort one another" by encouraging faithful discipleship in the church as the world grows darker and "the Day" of God's judgment draws nearer.
