Gift to the King Offering During our Youth/Children Christmas Program, December 4 at 5:00, we will collect our annual Gift to the King Offering. With the city of Hong Kong coming under control by the Chinese government in 2019, many residents fled the city for England. Among those fleeing were CP pastors and leaders. Together, they are beginning to establish ministries and worship communities.

<u>Loaves and Fishes</u> Thank you to everyone who supported our offering for a food sustainability program in Brazil. We will be working with other CPs to help provide food for 15 needy families for up to two years. 75% of our offering will go to that project and the remaining 25% will be distributed by the Highland CPWM to local organizations. The Highland church collected \$609.72. Thank you.
