For the past few Sundays my sermons have focused on the Book of Daniel. Through the stories about the dedication of God's faithful servant Daniel and his friends during the Babylonian exile, we have learned much about the sovereignty and faithfulness of God. I continue to be humbled and in awe of Daniel's devotion and God's reward.

Charlie Brown builds a beautiful sandcastle, works on it for hours. Finally he stands back, looks at it. It's wonderful. Just as he's admiring it, a storm comes up and blows over all of his sandcastle. Now, he's standing where his beautiful masterpiece was, on level sand, saying to himself, "I know there's a lesson in this, but I'm not sure what it is."

Life is not predictable; there are ups and downs along the way and sometimes the storms destroy our sandcastles. Trusting God when times are good, can be easy. However, when we experience difficulties and trials, and although we may question 'why?', it is during these storms when trusting God is of utmost importance. God's unchanging character and His Word can give us a firm foundation when things seem unsteady and uncertain. Trusting God is more than an emotional response in a stressful situation. Our trust should be built on faith in what the Scriptures say in spite of our feelings. Yes, emotions are important, but ultimately we need to analyze how we react to circumstances though the lens of faith and God's Word.

We may not know the 'why' or perhaps even the 'how,' but we should know and acknowledge God is in control. He is in control in order to accomplish His good, pleasing and perfect will for our lives. It's our decision to choose to trust God and let him work in us to be transformed. (Romans 12:1,2)

God is completely trustworthy, but He does not ask you to trust Him blindly. He wants you to learn to trust Him as you get to know Him. You can get to know God through personal time with Him in prayer and through His Word in study. With those tools, ask yourself what God may be doing, allowing or teaching in your current situation. Then, when we realize that even as a Christian we are not exempt from trials and hardships, we know for certain we can depend on God's power to accomplish His purpose for our lives. Live a life worthy of the calling so all can see that our God is faithful!

Now back to Charlie Brown and Daniel. What lesson can you glean from the Charlie Brown story - has a wave destroyed your sandcastle? How will you choose to react? Likewise, if you are not familiar with the stories of Daniel, I challenge you to read the first six chapters of the book so you can understand and learn more of God's faithfulness and sovereignty.
