What do we take from this? A significant element of our role to impact our young people is to serve as mentors. This means caring for individuals and taking interest in their lives. Mentoring young people means ensuring they are worshiping, reading scripture, and keeping focused on Jesus as their savior. We lead by example, too, so it's important to make sure that our relationships and interactions with others are God-honoring.

As we recognize needs for our youth to be advised or encouraged, we want to make sure we are doing so prayerfully. Whether you're up close and personal with our youth or observing from a distance, you can make an impact! Paul was far from Timothy when he wrote to him. We, too, can encourage from a distance as we keep up with our students and demonstrate our supportive intentions.

As we do this, we will find ourselves blessed, as well. God gives us young people not just for us to govern or monitor, but to genuinely join in our efforts and encourage us as we lead them.
