If you didn't know, Pam and I live in the country, surrounded by fields. The farmer who works the land by our house rotates crops; this year he planted corn, last year, wheat and soybeans. Every year we watch the process of sowing the seed, growth of the plants and reaping the harvest. It can be difficult but rewarding work.

In His teaching, Jesus used common and familiar practices to make his lessons come to life for the people. On one occasion He spoke to the disciples of a farmer who planted seed in three different areas (a sidewalk, gravel, and thorns). Compared to seed sown on fertile soil, these seed had no chance of survival. Later, Jesus interpreted his story to explain how the Word of God is received and believed by people. (Mark 4:1-20)

Jesus again uses the image of a farmer when he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Matt. 9:37-38

Sowing seeds and reaping a harvest. We understand the agricultural aspects, but how does that work for the Christian. Since we are all called to be ambassadors and witnesses for Christ our first job is to share the Gospel of Jesus, that through Him the world would be saved. One way to do that is through the way we live and greet our neighbors. Colossians 3 gives us some ideas of good seeds to sow: mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, forgiveness and love. The key is always seeking to bring Glory to God in all we do.

And then, like the farmer, we wait for the harvest. "Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains." James 5:7 and "A man reaps what he sows." Galatians 6:7 When we use what God has given us for His Glory and according to His will, we will see a harvest. God calls us be generous with what we have been given, whether it be time, resources, or talents. What you want to harvest determines your attitude. Know the harvest you are expecting and work toward it.

What seeds do you need to sow? Reconciliation? Forgiveness? Kindness? The Hope of Salvation to someone who doesn't know Jesus? Then cultivate a harvest of renewed relationships, the heart of a servant, peace of mind and joy in knowing someone now belongs to Jesus.
